CHRONIC PAIN HAS BOTH PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL ASPECTS.

Chronic Pain can be very painful for a dog, and just like in humans, pain can negatively impact dogs both physically and emotionally. The good news is this pain can be managed. In a recent study, dogs showed significant improvement in both their emotional and physical well-being with the pain under control.¹
